Thank you from the entire Board and the Lyme community.

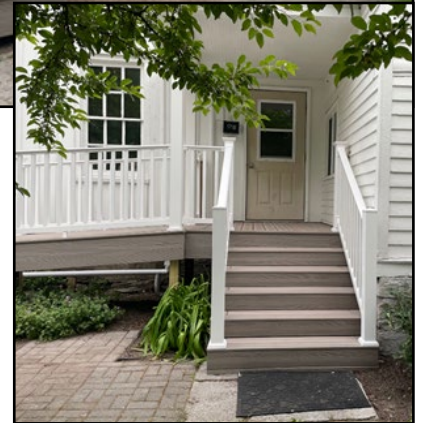

#5 – *Volunteers Bring Continued Success*

As we entered the 1980s, community support kept on growing along with LFL. *Friends of Lyme Free Library*, a volunteer support group, was formed in 1981. To this day, dedicated volunteers continue to support the Library by donating countless hours wherever and whenever needed. Their tasks include shelving books, leading children's story hours and craft sessions, helping with fundraising initiatives – and so much more. We can't thank them enough!

In 1985, North Country Library Systems (NCLS) awarded LFL their *Continuing Excellence Award*. The Library's *Summer Reading Program* began in 1990. In 1991, noting its ongoing commitment to community service, LFL was awarded the NCLS *Library Improvement Award*. It was also in 1991, a beautiful blue spruce tree

was planted on the Library grounds. Again, volunteers from the Lyme Garden Club continue today to keep our gardens beautiful and bountiful. We are indebted to them for all their hard work and diligent efforts.

To celebrate the Library's 75th anniversary, an Open House was held on December 5, 1998. Twenty-five years later, we're celebrating our 100th year! Please join us in celebrating this momentous occasion at several upcoming events.

The 12,500 Before Us:

The Native American Story In Our Region's Evolving Landscape

A Lyme Heritage Center Presentation

The retreat of the glaciers that shaped our region's terrain left a massive glacial lake covering much of our landscape. From the time of that lake and its demise some 13,000 years ago, Native peoples called our region home. They witnessed and adapted to massive, nearly unbelievable challenges coming with the intensive post-glacial changes to this landscape.

On Sunday, August 20th archaeologist Ken Knapp will give an overview of the history of our region's 12,500 plus years of Native American peoples and the remarkable evolving landscape. The program begins at 2 PM and is free.

Martha Horton: Point Salubrious Pioneer

In 1806 Martha Horton and her husband James became the first white settlers on Point Salubrious, which was then a frontier wilderness. The following remembrance was published after her death in 1862, and it recalls some of the difficulties she and other early settlers faced.

Excerpt of the article "Mrs. Martha Horton" published in The New York Daily Reformer (Watertown, NY), January 9, 1863:

People of the present day can hardly appreciate the dilemma of being without fire -- clear away from any human habitations but their own. If they had been provided with flint, steel and tinder (it was before the day of matches), such as most of the people in the backwoods settlements knew how to use for such purposes, they might have produced fire; but they had none. Mrs. Horton remembered that a log-heap

on a part of their clearing had been partially burned some time before and had gone out. She went with her little boy to make a critical examination. There was no smoke visible, neither any sensible heat about the blackened and charred remains of the log heap. She would be very sure that there was no spark of fire anywhere before she abandoned the search. One of the logs lay up a little from the ground in one place, and she directed her little boy to crawl under and examine the underside, which seemed to have been burned more than the upperside. He was provided with a knife to pick off the black coals. Her joy can be better imagined than described by words, as the little fellow at length sung out, "Fire! Fire! Mother, ain't you glad? Ain't you glad? She was not only *glad*, but *gratified*."

In the fall of that year, after they had got some wheat harvested and threshed, they went, with others, to Sackets Harbor to mill, carrying their grain in a small open boat, and taking with them only about one full day's provisions. The mill was a small one on the mouth of Mill Creek, which empties into Black River Bay, at Sackets Harbor. On their return the wind was contrary and they could not "double the point" called *Bull Rock*, which is at the extreme end of Pillar Point, in the present town of Brownville.

It was more than a week that they were thus "wind bound" on the south side of Pillar Point, where there were no inhabitants but some straggling Indian

parties, from whom they procured fire. They mixed up some of their flour with the water of the lake, and baked it on a flat stone "hoecake" fashion. This constituted their "bill of fare" only as they may have made slight additions to it with roots and berries, which in their season were found in great plenty in some places. It was a time of anxiety and trial for Mrs. Horton and her little ones. There was no way to solve the uncertainty which hung like a pall over the fate of the milling party -- whether they had ever reached the mill or whether they had undertaken to return in the night and had been driven by the opposing wind to some of the islands in the open lake; or had been "swamped" in their effort to round Bull Rock point, and were now sleeping "that sleep which knows no waking" in the bottom of the lake. All was a dark and painful uncertainty, and which required all her abiding faith in God's universal providence to endure.

The families at home were also on "short allowance" during all these long days of watching -- almost without hope. The milk of one cow was the only supply for the anxious mothers and the hungry children.

It looked as though they had "come into this wilderness to die there," and to try them and see what stuff they were made of. But at length the long watched for boat was descried, as soon as ever it came around the end of Point Salubrious, and by signals each of the parties signified to the other the fact of a joyful recognition. In due time the boat containing the faithful husbands and fathers, together with their precious freight, was safely moored to the shore, and the willing hands of the wives and mothers were engaged in preparing a sumptuous repast for the two families.

The James and Martha Horton house was built in 1819.


