From the Town Board

The Town of Lyme Town Board has been working for several years on plans for a new highway garage and office building. Preliminary cost estimates came in too high to be able to do both simultaneously. It was apparent that the highway garage was more urgent.

In December, the board unanimously passed the bond resolution, which must be done to allow the town to borrow money to finance this project. Also in December, the board unanimously accepted the contractors' bids. The project is now subject to public referendum because of a petition that was circulated in January.

Although the bond is for over five million dollars, that does not mean the town will need to borrow that much or that the project will ultimately cost that much.

The town is debt free and we have savings. There are also government programs which will reimburse us for at least 30% of the cost of the heating system.

The building committee and town board worked very hard to plan a building that will last for many years, be very economical to heat, and will protect our more than one million dollars' worth of equipment.

By moving the highway garage out of the village, we will eliminate the very dangerous entrance onto Route 12E.

On April 6th at 11 AM we will hold a public walk-through of our buildings. At 1 PM we will hold an informational presentation at the Chaumont Fire Hall. Feel free to view the plans and ask questions. The vote will be held on April 9th at the town offices. All registered voters are urged to participate.

Town Supervisor's message

Hello all,

First of all, Thank You all for putting your trust in me to protect our Town. And for those who did not, I hope to win your trust in the ensuing year to come.

This is what we are currently working on.

We initiated a referendum on the New Town garage for two reasons. One so that we have time to work with the engineering company that designed the building to reduce some of its costs.

Also, I am currently working with Senator Walczyk's staff and private organizations to seek grant monies that will also reduce the building's cost.

I am also putting together a plan to build our new Town Hall. I have selected a preexisting building that will only cost us site plan engineering fees and save on design expenses.

I am proposing the new site of the Town Hall to be behind our present Hall, keeping the Building accessible to the Town and Village residents as well as saving on sewer and water connections.

Later on in the year we will revisit the water line needs of our residents.

My office is always open for your concerns and ideas.

I would also urge all to attend our monthly Town meetings whenever possible in person or via the Internet.

My motto has always been, "The difficult we do immediately, the impossible takes us a little longer".

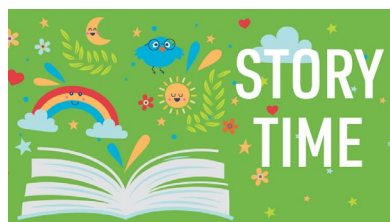

History Challenge!

F. In 1654 Father Simon le Moynes and a young Frenchman called Jean Baptiste visited native tribes in New York. They took the portage at the long carrying place and are therefore the first Europeans recorded to have been on Lyme's shores.

K. In 1806 James Horton from Colchester, Delaware County, became the first white settler on Point Salubrious. His descendants still live in the town.

I. In 1822, in an effort to eradicate wolves, Lyme offered a bounty of \$15.00 for each one killed in the town. They would pay \$10 for each of their "helps."

L. In 1835 residents lamented that there was no regular Sabbath worship at Chaumont but there were three taverns in the village.

J. In November 1851 the Watertown and Rome Railroad reached Chaumont, and Three Mile Bay shortly thereafter. (There was never a railroad spur to Point Peninsula.)

H. On November 25, 1855, at their home on Point Salubrious, David Ryder murdered his wife Hannah, then slit his own throat from ear to ear. He used a knife he'd bought for Cisco fishing. He had been the Lyme Town Supervisor 3 years earlier.

M. In 1875 A diphtheria epidemic killed an untold number of Lyme citizens, mostly children. There were 50 diphtheria deaths within the limits of the Chaumont village alone. The diphtheria antitoxin wasn't discovered until 1890. A vaccine was developed in the 1920s.

A. Chaumont, Three Mile Bay, and Point Peninsula were connected to Watertown by telephone in 1885.

N. In 1905 Ward Mount opened his dry goods store in Three Mile Bay. It remained open, and run by the Mount family, until 1994.

C. Chaumont got street lights in 1907, after a few decades of debate about the safety of electric lighting.

O. The Point Peninsula Post Office closed in 1941 due to the dwindling population of the village. It had opened in 1839 when the village was a thriving ship-building center. By 1941 the population of Point Peninsula village had dropped from 100 families to only 40. The number of year-round residents continued to drop throughout the 20th century.

B. On July 26, 1952 the Science lab at Lyme Central caught fire. Investigators theorized that the fire was caused by chemicals being stored there. The damage was repaired and school opened on time in September. (To the dismay of students.)

D. The Three Mile Bay school closed in July 1966. It was built in 1878 as the Three Mile Bay Union School. The original slate chalkboards were still being used when the school closed.

E. Ron Herrick organized the Bayside Music Fair, which took place on September 20, 1969 near where the Chaumont Beach is now. It was inspired by the Woodstock Festival, which took place a month earlier. (The bands were not Woodstock caliber, however -- one Canadian band didn't show up at the Chaumont event because the drummer's mother forbade him.)

G. On July 27, 2023 residents of Chaumont had to shelter in place to avoid potentially toxic smoke from a battery fire at the Chaumont Solar Farm.

Lyme Food Pantry

It's again time to look back at the history of the Lyme Food Pantry. In 1986 Harriette Hardy saw a need to help those in our vicinity "who for whatever reason were falling through the cracks". She visited Watertown Urban Mission to learn how to run a food pantry. Chaumont Presbyterian Church became the sponsor and Harriette used her own basement for distribution. The first year fifteen families were served.



By the 1990s there was much support from community residents, area businesses, banks, churches, school, scouts, fire departments, and many individuals too numerous to mention.

In August 2010, the Pantry purchased a small shed-like building and located it on Chaumont Presbyterian Church property. Harriette had housed the Pantry for 25 years. This new location added convenience for the workers and distribution and more privacy for both the customers and the Hardys. By this time 66 persons per month were requesting food.

In 2014 Harriette retired due to poor health. She along with her many donors and dedicated volunteers had "let no one go hungry" for 28 years! Joan O'Brien, who had been helping for many years, took over the coordinating until end of 2019. Judy Rusho assumed responsibility in 2020. COVID precautions were used as necessary.

In the spring of 2022 the original pantry shed had become extremely crowded with increased numbers receiving a greater variety of items. A 14'x32' storage barn was purchased and delivered to the Chaumont Presbyterian Church parking lot. Church members finished the interior, and changed the door and ramp. A volunteer crew moved shelves, refrigerator, freezers, and food items to set up the interior.

The Pantry remains open year round for any Lyme resident who is in need of assistance on a once a monthly base. In 2023, 574 people received assistance. During the holidays of Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter extra items are provided for special meals.

Each Christmas there has always been a huge distribution with food as well as gifts and treats for the children. Many families are helped to have a very Merry Christmas.

The Pantry continues to be completely funded by community donations of food and money and is totally run by volunteers. **No person should go hungry.**

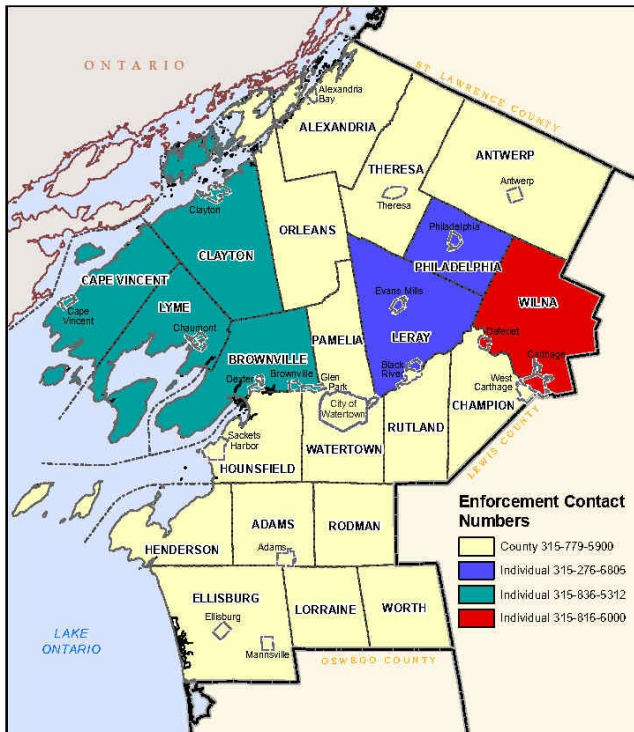
(This article was also in the Jan/Feb 2024 Lyme Light. However - the information is still pertinent as animals are apt to feel the need to run when the weather improves.)

If you were unaware, Jefferson County is split into multiple districts when it comes to dog control. Back in the day (40 years ago) if a stray dog came into your yard, you simply called the county Dog Control and someone came to pick that dog up. Or if you lost your dog, you called the County Pound to see if anyone had brought your dog in.

Now the county is split into different areas with different officers covering different jurisdictions. The area for the Town of Lyme (as well as the towns of Cape Vincent, Clayton and Brownville) is covered by one person. If you have stray that appears, or have lost a dog, please contact Betsy Ring at (315) 836-5312.

Also, if you are on Facebook, the Group listed as **Town Dog Control for Brownville, Cape Vincent, Clayton, and Lyme** is an excellent resource.
