Village Notes

Seasonal Brush Pickup

Brush pickup will take place on the last Thursday of each month, now through October 31st. Please limit brush to 4 ft. lengths and no larger than 3 in. diameter. We kindly request consideration on the amount of brush you put out to the curb. No professional tree service removal. Please place brush out only on the last week of the month – this eliminates the safety hazard of debris blowing into the street.

Water Service Line Inventory

The Village of Chaumont will be conducting an upcoming water service line inventory to provide needed information for oversight and reporting to EPA. This inventory will provide essential information to help our water system comply with the Lead and Copper Rule Revisions requirement by October 16, 2024. Please be on the lookout for a survey with your next water bill to help our Department of Works staff complete this important task. In conjunction with historical records, building permits, and water maintenance reports, your cooperation and input in identifying the customer-owned section of service line material will be an immeasurable help toward compliancy for the Village of Chaumont. We thank you in advance for your consideration and support!



Town Update

On April 9, 2024, the Town of Lyme held a Public Referendum to vote on the Bond Resolution to borrow funds to build a new Town Highway Garage. 250 Town Residents voted in the special election. Of those Town Residents, 96 voted against the proposition and 154 voted in favor of the proposition. Thus, the proposition was approved, and the Town Board will take the steps necessary to move forward with the project. We appreciate the residents for participating in this referendum.

Lyme Heritage Center

The Bedford Journal: 1810-1840

The Lyme Heritage Center sells fascinating books covering the history of the Town of Lyme. One of our most popular is **The Bedford Journal**, John Wiley Bedford's memoir about life in this area between 1810 and 1844.

John Wiley Bedford was born near Picton, Ontario in 1810, but moved to Grenadier Island as a toddler; Grenadier Island was a part of Lyme until 1849. He begins his memoir telling about this move in 1815. (What follows has retained his original grammar and spelling.)

As soon as the War of 1812 closed my father hastened to leave the Yankeehating "Canucks" and go to live with his own countrymen. 1 was about four and a half years old at that time. We moved by water in a small boat called a skiff, across the lower end of Lake Ontario, a distance of about 40 miles. This is the first time that I remember of ever being on the water. My mother sat in the stern of the boat holding her baby, my brother Alexander,

about two years old. My father sat in the centre of the boat and rowed it, and myself in the bow on a bundle of bed clothes. I spent most of that day looking into the water. I thought it a great curiosity to see the boat glide over the water, but it was a long day to me. We landed at my grandmother Bedford's on Grenadier Island. My grandmother and two of my father's brothers, Jacob and Andrew, kept a hotel on this island. They had settled on the island before the war.

Grenadier Island is about two and a half miles long and one and a half miles wide and contains 1400 acres of good tillable land situated in the town of Lyme, Jefferson County, State of New York. It is about one mile from the mainland in the nearest place. There is a beautiful harbour at the east end of Grenadier which is formed by the wash of gravel and sand that are worked along by the surf from the lake storms which form parallel points, each on opposite corners of the island. The beautiful harbour is completely landlocked by the mainland on the north and Fox Island on the east. The water is deep enough for any vessel that sails the lake and large enough to hold all of them.


This island became noted as the headquarters of General Wilkinson's Army of 10,000 men for nearly a year during the War of 1812. The army devastated all improvements on the

island, killed all the cattle and hogs and poultry and even horses for fresh meat, destroyed fences and out houses although the officers forbid and ordered them not to meddle with anything that did not belong to them. So there was an account kept of the property destroyed and the bill presented to Congress which was allowed and paid which partially made up for their losses.

The camp disease or epidemic broke out among the soldiers, of which many died. My grandfather took this disease, of which he

died. Long since that time I have seen rough coffins of the deceased soldiers laid bare in pasture fields where the cattle had pawed the dirt off of them and I have looked in and seen their skeletons. I have picked up many pounds of leaden bullets along the shore of the Harbour. I have found axes and picks and shovels and many other relicts of this army.

Bedford goes on to relate many other interesting stories about the earliest days of Jefferson County. The Lyme Heritage Center sells **The Bedford Journal** for \$25, plus \$4.50 shipping and handling. Please contact us at *lymeheritagecenter@gmail.* com to place your order!



Lake Monster Memorial Day Run

Sunday, May 26th at 9 AM

The Lake Monster 5k, 12K, and 1.5 mile walk begins in Chaumont village center, at the historic Alexander Copley House. Runners then make their way to Point Salubrious for a 5K out and back or 12K loop along the scenic Lake Ontario shoreline with views of Guffin, Sawmill and Chaumont Bay, as well as Cherry Island. A 1.5 mile walk will follow the same direction as the 5K and will also be out and back. Our Lake Monster logo and t-shirts were designed by a Lyme Central School student, Rosamond Hunt. The creature is A Great Blue Heron, Osprey and Northern Pike hybrid and represents the lush Great Lakes wildlife. Pre-registration is 25 dollars and day of registration is 30 dollars, this price includes race timing chip. The 1.5 mile walk is not timed and the costs is 15 dollars. Proceeds will benefit Lyme Parks and **Recreation** and the **Lyme Community Foundation**.
