Lyme Community Foundation Celebrates 25th Anniversary

The Lyme Community Foundation began in 1998 when a small group of local residents held a meeting to decide what types of services and programs might be able to be held at the Copley House, which was being donated by Georgia Borden and Robert Cox. The original idea was to open a childcare center but after a walkthrough of the building it was clear the house was in too much disrepair and could not be used to care for children. The group then decided the building could be used for art classes, dance classes, and other events for the community. The Lyme Community Foundation received their 501(c)(3) Not for Profit Status, and the rest is history. The foundation received grants and donations and the entire house has been renovated to make it what it is today.

Through the past 25 years the Copley House (Now the Lyme Community Center) has provided too many programs to include. Here are some of our most exciting events and activities:

- ★ Fashion Show with Maggie Rizer was held on the lawn of the foundation
- ★ Fall Festival began in 1998 and was held for numerous years
- ★ The lease on the house was signed in September of 1999
- ★ The Lyme Light newsletter began in 1999
- * A skating rink was started in the winter of 2000 and continued for many years (until the weather didn't cooperate)
- * ACTE II clothing store was run solely by volunteers which provided low cost clothing to the community and the money raised helped keep the lights and heat on for the foundation for many years
- ★ Foundation began offering Scholarships to Lyme students in 2000
- ★ A Copley descendent, Robert Albright, donated money to the foundation and a yearly Volunteer of the Year Award was started to honor those who have made a difference in the community
- ★ The annual Holiday House Tour was held each year and was a favorite for everyone in the community.
- ★ 5K-10 K began in May of 2000 and is still being held each year
- ★ The first Lyme Community Foundation golf tournament was held in 2000 and was held for many years
- ★ The Haunted House was held for many years. This event was a real community event that included many Lyme students and local residents and raised a large amount of money for the foundation
- ★ Lyme Central School has held their Junior Prom crowning for many years at the house
- ★ Lyme Central has held their homecoming and other events at the house
- ★ Numerous bridal and wedding showers have been held
- * Weddings have been held out back on the stage and others were held out front or in the house
- ★ Summer drama programs were held for many years on our stage out back
- ★ 10 Mountain Division Band has played concerts for the community at the Copley House
- ★ Dance classes for young children have been held by Cindy Babel for many years
- * Summer outdoor movies were held on the front lawn
- ★ Numerous art classes, exercise programs, and other programs for adults have been offered
- * Lymies on the Loose have been traveling around the area enjoying various events and dining at local restaurants
- ★ Office of the Aging Free Lunch Program each month is well attended
- ★ Our weekly Farmer's Market has been a hit for the community
- ★ The Copley House was recently renamed as the Lyme Community Center to demonstrate to the community that our house belongs to the entire community
- ★ Our first annual gala was recently held this fall to honor Billy Patterson and it was a huge success

There are many additional events and programs that have been offered at the Lyme Community Center over the past 25 years, but there are just too many to mention them all. We thank all of the former and current local residents who have served on the Lyme Community Foundation Board over the past 25 years. We thank the community for their continued support and we look forward to seeing what the next 25 years will bring for the Lyme Community Foundation.





Lyme Heritage Center

Analyzing our Artifacts

The Lyme Heritage Center has a fascinating collection of historical materials. Our oldest items are the Native American artifacts which have been

found all around town.

On July 27th Fort Drum archaeologist Karen Koekenberg visited the Heritage Center to examine our Native collection, American which includes pottery arrowheads. shards. and various stone tools.

Ms. Koekenberg analyzed these materials using a



materials using a PXRF (portable X-ray fluorescence) machine. The PXRF determines the elemental composition of artifacts, and may help determine their origins. Prior PXRF analyses have shown that some Native tools found in the North Country originated as far away as Ohio and Maine, as evidenced by the type of stone from which they were crafted. Archaeologists have used such findings to determine that a vast Native trading network existed across the northeast for centuries before European settlers arrived.

Ms. Koekenberg is still analyzing the data, but she was able to send us preliminary information on a few of the pieces. She found that most of the examined artifacts were made of Onondaga chert, which can be found throughout Northern New York. It was a common material for stone tools in the region, and it's not a surprise that several of the tools were made of this material.

However, she found that a few of the artifacts were made with more exotic materials. For example



one projectile point appears to be made of Normanskill chert, which is found in southeastern New York throughout the Hudson Valley. Another stone tool was visually similar to some exotic cherts found on one the islands near Clayton. The data showed that this object could have come from as far away as Maine.

Ms. Koekenberg notes that more detailed analysis is needed, but we're very excited by her early findings!
