We will call back to set up a mutual time for food pickup. For confidentiality only first names are used in the Pantry and pickups are scheduled 15 minutes apart.

The Pantry food and supplies come from generous food drives, giveaways, and monetary donations. Also accepted are food donations which can be left outside in the a gray cabinet on site or in the box located at the post office. Monetary donations can be mailed to Lyme Food Pantry P.O. 176, Chaumont, N.Y. 13622.

When summer ends, as cottagers and renters close their summer places, the Pantry is glad to accept any unopened food, toiletries, and cleaning supplies. We have freezers and refrigerators to use for storing items. Arrangements must be made for accepting foods needing these appliances.

We THANK YOU one and all for the fresh fruit and vegetables received grown locally, as well as all the staples donated. To help keep the Pantry comfortable during the summer, we appreciated receiving a used air conditioner.

As always with the never ending support of the community, people in need can be fed. During the first 7 months of 2023, the Lyme Food Pantry fed 213 individuals filling 87 requested orders! THANK YOU to the volunteer workers who give their time and energy to have this happen!!

### Lyme Central School update

Greetings to all!

At the close of the summer season, Lyme Central School was host to the Summer Theater Institute which is comprised of 50 students ranging in age from 5 to 15 years old and representing 6 school districts. This marks the 7th year of this unique theater camp which operates primarily through grant funds awarded by the Jefferson County Youth Bureau and matched in-kind by Lyme Central School. The camp is under the direction of Mr. Jim Goodenbery, Mrs. Tanya Roy, Ms. Amanda Morrison, and our very own ELA teacher, Mrs. Leah Martineau. This year's play was Madagascar, Jr and it was wonderful. Students had one week of camp to learn their lines and song lyrics before performing their production in the evening of their final day of camp. This is quite an undertaking by all involved but such a rewarding experience.

As we enter into another school year here at Lyme, we want all of our visitors to know that we now have the ability to offer guest wifi access. This means that if you are on our school property, you will now have the capability to access the internet while in the stands at a sporting event, on the playground, or in the building for a parent meeting, etc. To do so: please follow these steps:

- 1. Open your wifi settings and choose the LCSD-Guest wifi in the available networks (include dash!).
- 2. On the password screen enter **Lakers2023!** Click "Connect".
- 3. A splash page will appear stating the rules and terms of service for the network. Click "Continue" if you agree. You will be held to the same standard as our Acceptable Use Policy.
- 4. You are now connected to the internet!

And finally, Lyme Central School will be seeking the community's support in late Fall to approve a building project which will allow for improvements and renovations to the building's failing infrastructure and operating systems. It has been several years since the District has undergone this type of upgrade and the wear and tear on the building is evident. The District will be sending out more information in the weeks to come. Please consider attending *a public information session* to learn more about these improvements on *October* 

12th, 2023, prior to our BOE meeting which will be held in the library of Lyme Central School. The building project will have no impact on our taxpayers. Eligible voters are welcome to vote on this proposition on Tuesday, October 24th, 2023 during the hours of 7 AM to 8 PM at the school.

### What to do with fall decorations...?

The decorations of fall - pumpkins, corn stalks, variegated corn, and hay bales. They add to the festiveness of our houses and the season, but what do you do with them after the season is over?

All of these decorations are organic, so they don't necessarily have to go in the garbage. If you have land, even a small lot, composting is an option for these items. It doesn't have to be in a designated composting bin, but put these things in a spot that is out of general sight where the organic material can decompose over time. Animals can use the material for bedding (corn stalks, hay from the bales) and food (the rind from the pumpkin or the kernels from the corn) and the rest can decompose down into rich, organic soil.

So next time, before you send these items to the land fill, see if there isn't a small corner of your lot where it can break down and give its nutrients back to the soil.
