Town Talk

From the purchase and development of Veterans Memorial Park, to the improvements to Bicentennial Park, and the continual upkeep and enhancement to the athletic fields, the Town of Lyme works hard to provide a variety of venues to address the many recreational pursuits of its residents - boaters, sports teams and leagues, picnickers, fishermen, and summer day campers.

Our residents might be surprised by the amount of effort it takes to keep these facilities maintained and in good condition, and also the time and consideration required to ensure their most optimal use by many entities. Many decisions are made each year regarding such things as mowing contracts, events scheduling, use by outside organizations, the purchase of equipment, and fencing repairs /replacement.

Now, with the opening of the Lyme

Veterans Memorial Park in the near future, a new set of challenges faces the Town Board. As you may recall, an early plan had been announced to form a committee to address this new park. Recently, however, it was decided to expand the scope to create a Steering Committee to advise the Town Board on ALL recreation facilities in the Town of Lyme. This would include such elements as suggestions for future expansion, guidelines for usage, i.e. types of events, hours of operation, landscaping ideas, amenities and equipment and other operational recommendations.

Interested residents who wish to be considered for this committee are asked to email Town Supervisor Countryman at supervisor@townoflyme.com and describe their interest, any relevant experience and particular skills that will serve to enrich the group's success. It is important to note that this would be considered a standing committee that would meet on some regular basis to be decided by its members.

Park Update: We are happy to report that construction continues on schedule at Lyme Veterans Memorial Park! Regular monthly meetings are held between members of Town government, BCA Architects (the engineers of the project,) all contractors engage on the REDI project as well as representatives from several NYS agencies, such as DOS, DEC, DASNY and the Governor's Office. These meetings ensure compliance with project objectives, accountability for all expenditures, coordination between the various contractors and project oversight by the engineers.

Progress has become more evident as weeks pass. Construction on the building that will house the

restrooms and utilities has been the focus during the last several months, with several exterior and interior projects completed. Installation of the roof system is scheduled to begin the second week of April, as is initial masonry work. The dock is being fabricated at this time and coordination of its installation is under discussion. The final phases will include the landscaping and plantings in the park.

Many thanks to the Town of Lyme Highway Department staff for its vital participation in many aspects of the site work necessary to make this project a success.

We look forward to celebrating with you all at a festive ribbon cutting celebration once the park becomes REDI for our residents to enjoy!

Lake Monster Memorial Day Run

Sunday, May 28th at 9 AM

The Lake Monster 5k, 12K, and 1.5 mile walk begins in Chaumont village center, at the historic Alexander Copley House. Runners then make their way to Point Salubrious for a 5K out and back or 12K loop along the scenic Lake Ontario

shoreline with views of Guffin, Sawmill and Chaumont Bay, as well as Cherry Island. A 1.5 mile walk will follow the same direction as the 5K and will also be out and back. Our Lake Monster logo and t-shirts were designed by a Lyme Central School student, Rosamond Hunt. The creature is A Great Blue Heron, Osprey and Northern Pike hybrid and represents the lush Great Lakes wildlife. Pre-registration is 25 dollars and day of registration is 30 dollars, this price includes race timing chip. The 1.5 mile walk is not timed. Proceeds will benefit Lyme Parks and Recreation and the Lyme Community Foundation.







#2 - LFL Gets A New, Permanent Home


In 1931, the Library was located on Mill Street in Chaumont. Later that year, the Crumb property (LFL's current site) was deeded to the village by former residents, Mr. and Mrs. Austin Rogers. Mr. Rogers was a Cape Vincent native and President of Rogers Brothers Seed Company, which for many years, housed its main offices on the Main Street, Chaumont property, consisting of a large double house, two smaller buildings, and a large lot just across Horse Creek Bridge. Mr. Rogers and his brother and partner, Everett Rogers, later relocated their business to several locations throughout the Midwest, until finally setting in Chicago, Illinois. Their grandfather, Austin Rogers, was a pioneer settler in the town of Cape Vincent.

As a CWA government project under Mayor George Tuttle, the donated house was remodeled in 1933 for library use. Having been built by Alexander Copley in 1836, it is one of the oldest building in Chaumont. Approximately 100 books were also received and readied for circulation that year, including While Rome Burns by Alexander Wollcott; Managing One's Self by J.G. Gilky; and Singing in the Rain by A.S. Monroe. The Library was first wired for electricity in 1935. The Enos Family donated a library sign in 1936, with Mr. Francis Gaumont also donating his services for its lettering. Although the Library has undergone several renovations throughout the years, it has continued operations on this property ever since.

Lyme Food Pantry is located here in Chaumont for those in need of food assistance. It is helpful to please call 315-

649-2424 on Wednesday. The order for food can then be picked up Thursday when are volunteers are available. Exceptions are possible however, to accommodate transportation, working hours, etc.

Generally we do not deliver food orders. However, in helping our Bayview Apartment residents, we



do reach out to them on Tuesday. The Pantry weekly packs a variety of items and places them on the freebie table in Bayview's community room. The residents enjoy sharing the items, and we enjoy friendly chats with them. Of course individual complete orders are always welcome.

Waiting at the bridge construction light, we have seen the workers in the weather elements. The idea came to the Pantry and the Presbyterian Church to provide some homemade hot soup to warm workers up and show our appreciation for the bridge construction. We also included brownies and pumpkin bread for dessert.

All ingredients used in the following recipe for Italian Ham and Bean Soup came from the Pantry; serves 8. Cook in slow cooker low 6-8 hrs.

- 3 15 oz cans of beans rinsed and drained
- 2 1/2cups cubed cooked ham
- 1 1/2 cups chopped carrots
- 1 cup sliced celery
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 2- 14.5 oz canned diced tomatoes undrained
- 1 can spinach or fresh
- 2-14.5oz chicken broth

Seasonings: basil, garlic, oregano

When serving, add parmesan cheese on top & Enjoy!!!!!! As always thank you for all food and monetary donations to the Pantry.
