Lyme Garden Club

When gardeners garden, it is not just plants that grow, but the gardeners themselves ~ Ken Druse

Summer is speeding by! All through 2019 we will share a Horticulture Calendar with you that will provide monthly gardening activities, tips and reminders. The following are gardening suggestions for the month of August.

- Lift, divide, and replant Japanese, Siberian and Bearded iris and phlox.
- Remove oversized cucumbers, squash and beans to encourage young fruits to develop and new flowers to form.
- Enjoy herbs. Fresh leaves can be picked as soon as the plant has enough foliage to maintain growth. To ensure good oil content and flavor, pick leaves or seeds after dew has disappeared but before the sun becomes too hot. For use dried, harvest leaves before flower buds open, and seeds as the color changes from green to brown or gray. Wash dirty leaves and seeds with cold water and drain thoroughly before drying.
- Remove old flowers from annuals and perennials to encourage more flowers, remove unwanted seeds.
- You can still plant some crops from seed such as leaf lettuce, peas and spinach. Spinach planted now will be enjoyed into October and November.
- The cooler temperatures, adequate moisture and less weed competition make the middle of August through September most favorable to sprout seeds and grow grass seedlings.
