Town of Lyme update

From the supervisor:

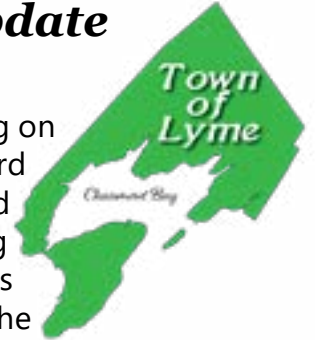
At the regular Town Meeting on April 9, 2025 The Town board will vote on an amended bond resolution authorizing the issuance of serial bonds or an installment bond of the Town of Lyme in an amount not to exceed \$4,822,656.52, the proceeds of which are to be used for site preparation and construction of a new Highway Barn for the Town of Lyme.

If passed, there will be Notice of Special Election on Tuesday, May 13, 2025. The voting will be as follows: Shall the Town spend a maximum of \$4,822,656.52 to construct a new Highway Barn? Voters must meet eligibility requirements in order to vote in a special election.

There will also be an announcement in the Watertown Daily Times and on the Town Website regarding the election and eligibility requirements.

From the Town of Lyme Board

The Town of Lyme has received monies from the State of New York to make improvements to our recreational parks. The two parks in consideration are the *Bicentennial Park* and *Veterans Memorial Park*.

Bicentennial Park is located just off NYS Route 12E and Wilson Lane, this park is located right next to the Village of Chaumont Beach. This park borders the Chaumont River and Chaumont Bay and offers a large area for picnics, family gatherings and live music events.

Veterans Memorial Park is the Town's newest park and is located on NYS Route 12E across from the Town Buildings. This park overlooks Sawmill Bay and offers public docks, public restrooms, and a walking path. This park is within walking distance to local restaurants and shopping.

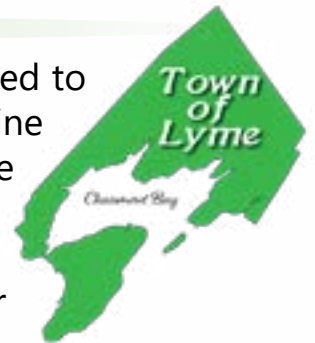
