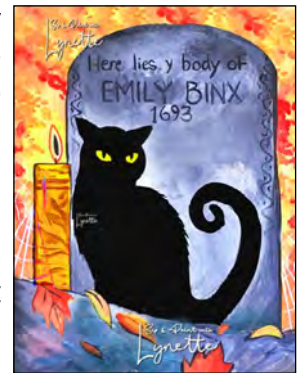
Bridge - Mondays 7 PM. No session on Labor Day, September 2. Call Catherine Carr to register. (315) 222-4429.

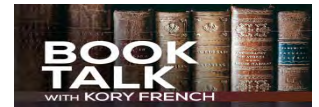



Lyme Garden Club

"Autumn is a second spring when every leaf is a flower."
- Albert Camus

Summer is fading. The days are growing shorter. But there is no lack of gardening opportunities! All through 2019 we will share a Horticulture Calendar with you to provide monthly gardening activities, suggestions, tips and reminders.

September

- This is a good time to plant trees and shrubs. The Cornell Guide for Planting and Maintaining Trees and Shrubs is available as a PDF online.
- Spinach planted now will be enjoyed into October and November.
- Divide and replant daylilies.
- Middle of August through September is most favorable to sprout seeds and grow grass.

October

- Plant garlic and shallots now for harvest next year.
- Plant daffodil, hyacinth, lily and other bulbs.
- Pick up and discard all fallen fruit around trees.
- Keep watering newly planted trees and shrubs right up until the ground freezes. Watering deeply encourages deep root growth.
- Dig and divide early flowering perennials that have clumped up. Replant the vigorous outer parts of the clump.
- Dig dahlia, canna and tuberous begonia after the first killing frost.
- Pick remaining mature green tomatoes and store them at 55 degrees.
- Clean up the perennial garden as plants die back. It's nice to leave some seed heads for the birds and for winter interest.
- Avoid putting seedy weeds in your compost pile.
- Bring in houseplants that were outside for the summer.

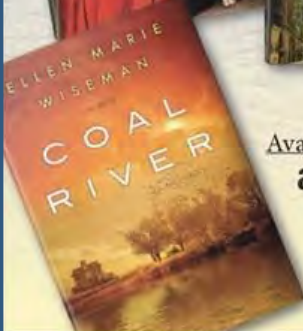
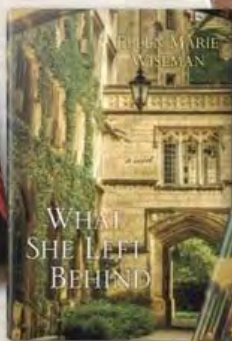

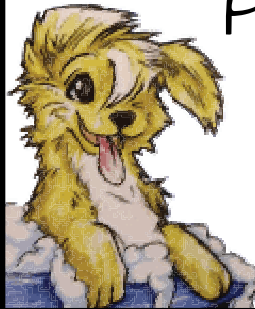
